GARDEN PLANNING

- Learn the date of your first frost and your last frost and record them
- Identify the location of your garden and its dimensions
- Determine the types of plants you want to grow
- Research the ideal planting times for each type of plant in your area
- Make a planting schedule for each plant, including planting dates and expected harvest dates
- Plan your garden layout, taking into account the spacing requirements of each plant
- Make sure to rotate the right vegetables for maximum soil health

UNDERSTANDING PLANTING ZONES FOR A SUCCESSFUL GARDEN



Taking the time each year to carefully inventory your seed stock is a wise practice, ideally done at the beginning of the year. I personally make it a point to do this in January. By creating a list of all the seeds you currently have, you can see what seeds you need to purchase.

Given the ongoing food crisis affecting our nation, it is increasingly critical to place your seed orders as early as possible. Early ordering not only ensures you get the varieties you need but also helps you avoid potential shortages due to high demand or supply chain disruptions. This proactive approach is key to a successful and bountiful gardening season.

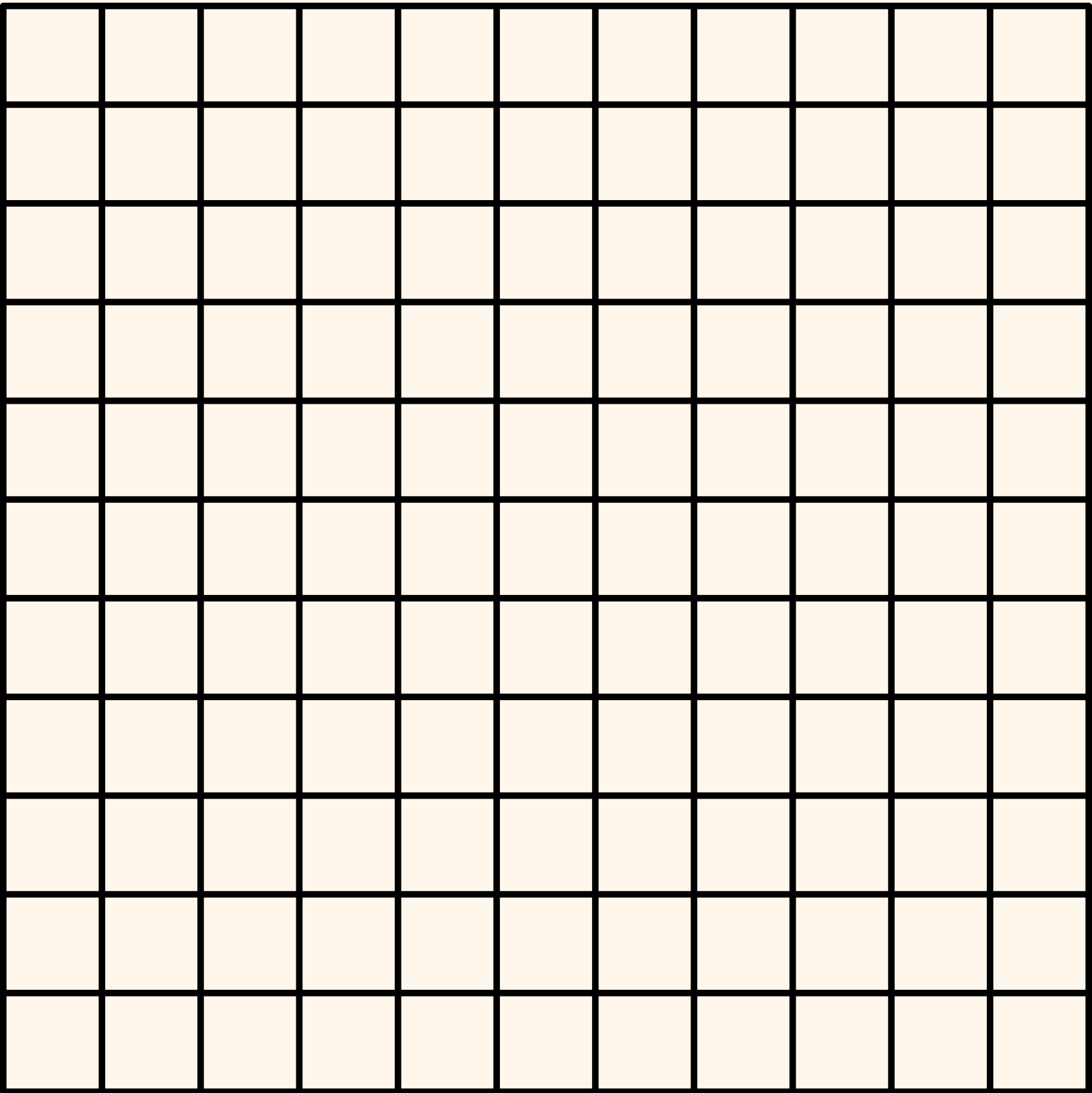

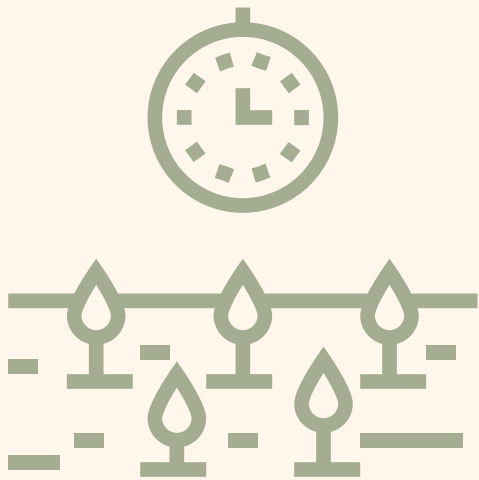


Creating a detailed garden layout is not only beneficial for managing crop rotation but also serves as an invaluable tool for monitoring the performance of various vegetables grown in specific locations. This approach allows you to meticulously observe and record crucial factors such as sunlight exposure, shade levels, and soil composition. For instance, you can assess if certain plants received excessive sun or if they were overly shaded.

Utilize the following pages to meticulously chart the layout of your garden last year, and to plan the layout for the current year. This will enable you to compare and adjust your planting strategy effectively.

If you didn't have a garden last year, this is an excellent opportunity to begin your gardening journey and establish a baseline for future reference and improvement.





PLANTING SCHEDULE

- Write down the date you planted each type of plant seed
- Write down the expected germination date for each type of plant
- Write down the expected harvest date for each type of plant
- Track any changes to your planting schedule, such as delays or early plantings

GARDEN OBSERVATIONS


- If you're new to gardening or gardening in a new area, write down the weather conditions on a daily basis
- With over 45 years of gardening experience, I find making weekly notes of weather conditions helps us chart weather patterns.
- Monitor the growth and development of your plants
- Write down any issues or problems with your plants, such as pest infestations or disease and what you did about it
- Take photos of your garden throughout the season to track progress



- It will be helpful to write down the date and amount of each harvest. This will help you determine if you planted enough for your family
- Keep track of which plants produced the most yield
- Make note of what your family liked and did not like
- Note any issues or problems encountered during the harvest

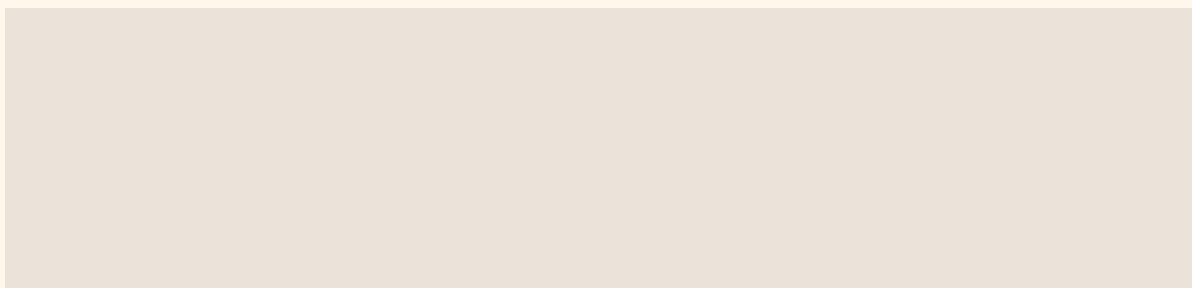
